To be considered for the essay challenge and being published in *PLOS Biology* or *PLOS Medicine*, authors agree to abide by the following policies and formatting guidelines:

[Open Access via CC BY license](#)

You retain the copyright to your essay, but you agree to have the Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY) license applied to it. Under this OA license, you are agreeing that anyone may copy, distribute, or reuse the content as long as you and the journal are properly cited. If your essay contains any photos, images, figures, etc., that you or your co-authors do not own, we will need proof that the owner of that content has both given you written permission to use it and has approved it being published under a CC BY license.

[Declaration of Competing Interests](#)

You agree to declare all actual or potential competing interests, for transparency (a competing interest can be OK, as long as it is known). A competing interest is anything that interferes with, or could reasonably be perceived as interfering with, the full and objective presentation, peer review, or publication of your essay.

[Publishing Ethics](#)

Any plagiarized content will be identified by our tools that screen all submitted content and will not be considered. Your essay will be treated as strictly confidential until published. The review process is confidential to all parties. Correspondence as part of the review process should also be treated confidentially by all parties, including you as the author(s).

[Data Availability](#)

It is not anticipated that you present original data in your essays. If you do, we require all underlying data to be publicly available without restriction at the time of publication. If there are specific legal or ethical restrictions prohibiting public sharing of a data set, you must indicate how others can get access to the data.

[Funding Disclosure](#)

Declare any funding received that underpins or can be connected to the work of writing this essay. Please give specific details such as funder name, grant numbers, and the funder's website.

Formatting Guidelines

Title length	Maximum 75 characters
Abstract length	~100 words
Manuscript length	~1,500 words The essays are meant to be brief and succinct please ensure that you do not exceed these limits
References	NONE needed
Display items (figures, text boxes, tables)	1 Submitted figures must be publishable under the CC-BY license, thus, with few exceptions, we cannot accept previously published work
