






Over 80% of staff at foundations are experimenting with Al


Just 30% of foundations have an Al policy

How would you rate your current understanding of Al and its potential usage to support your work?






In your work, which of the following are you currently doing with Al?







In your work, which of the following would you like to do with Al?






"In your work, which of these would you like to do with AI?"


